## Overview

The following titles were filmed by the University of Washington Libraries as part of the *Preserving the History of U.S. Agriculture and Rural Life Grant Project* funded and supported by the National Endowment of the Humanities (NEH), Cornell University, the United States Agricultural Information Network (USAIN), and other land-grant universities.

This list contains 109 titles but please note that several title changes are listed under one entry (for example, *The ranch* entry contains four title changes) and, if all of these title changes are included, a total of 128 titles were filmed.
